As the youngest of six children, Frances Ridley Havergal (1836–1879) suffered from intense childhood loneliness. Then, when her mother died unexpectedly, further anguish ripped through her grief stricken, 11-year-old heart. But when she opened her life to Jesus in her teens, she found comfort in knowing she would never again be alone. "Earth and heaven seemed brighter from that moment," she wrote.
