Together Constantly in Prayer

On this Racial Justice Sunday here is part of a statement on behalf of the Methodist Church;

'This year is an important one for racial justice on these shores as it marks the '30th anniversary of RJS'. Racial Justice was established by the Methodist Church in 1995 following the tragic racist murder of black teenager Stephen Lawrence in Southeast London in April 1993. The Lawrence family attended the local Methodist Church in that part of the capital and the Methodist Church agreed to support the family justice campaign to find young Steven's killers. A few years later the churches' commission for racial justice, a churches together in Britain and Ireland program, agreed to mainstream the special Sunday so that all the churches could engage with it.

We believe that the universe was created by a loving God who chose to become a human being in Jesus Christ who has redeemed the world and sent the Holy Spirit to enable us to love one another with God's love. All human beings are equally children of God and loved by God. Since none is outside the love of God, none should be outside our love either. We believe that diversity of the human race was no mistake on God's part. God deliberately created variety within the human family and wants us to take as much delight in that variety as God does'.

Lord, we believe that it is important to make time to give thanks for our diversity and to pray for your help in overcoming our prejudices and the injustices that reflect and reinforce them. Amen
