Of all that has been happening since Christmas I have chosen three highlights.

On Jan 10th I was pleased to represent MWiB at the service of celebration for the life of Elizabeth Dunn Wilson a former president of Network. The service was at Emmanuel Eastbourne, lovely bright and welcoming building on a chilly day. A large MWiB candle was lit at the start of the service. Family photos were used to celebrate the life and ministry of both Elizabeth and her husband and what a wonderful roller coaster of a life it was. We saw Elizabeth outside 10 Downing St with a petition during her time as Network president, in the mission field in Panama and Kenya. Elizabeth used her skills as a teacher to pioneer creative worship for children and took a real interest in promoting women's health. It was good to hear tributes from colleagues, church friends and family and reflections on her legacy.

Afterwards I met with one of the stewards who is keen to set up an MWiB group having attended the district day at Battle that I led last year.

On Jan 18th both Leonora and I attended a District Day at Wesley's Chapel hosted by London District President Lilla Hercules. Based around 'Give thanks with a grateful heart' Leonora spoke in the morning about the 16 days of activism and future plans and in the afternoon worship I reflected on "An attitude of gratitude". It was a wonderful joyous day with news of two new groups, amazing singing, bags of enthusiasm and endless cake





News from CoChair Leonora Wassell

Be a disruptor!

Following on from the 16 Days of Activism which we took part in last November, I decided I needed to educate myself on the issue of





This video challenges men to look at how they treat women. I was so impressed by it that I contacted Michelle Bucknor the Deputy Director of Press Red and had a very animated conversation with her over zoom. She told me about the resources on offer from Be a Disruptor! Course, Control, a theatrical event designed to make churches aware of the issue of Domestic abuse, and their work in schools. Michelle characterised the role of Press Red as being at the top of a precipice helping to stop abuse from happening.

I duly signed up for the next Disruptor! Course to be held in at the Coach House Church, Stockport. "At the end of the training, participants will know how to respond to abuse, to recognise sexism, know that they are not alone and become skilled in how to challenge their mates without it turning into a confrontation." We looked at the



statistics which were shocking. This is considered a national crisis. What was also shocking was that 41% of domestic abuse happens to church members. We role played a variety of situations that we might find ourselves in within church as well as at work or in the community.

That was challenging as we identified unconscious bias. In the safety of this event, we were able to share stories of our own lived experiences. How to be alongside people who are experiencing abuse was tackled as we looked at how to disrupt a situation we may be witnessing. I would certainly recommend the course for churches, circuits, or districts. This could be arranged as an area MWiB event.

Community Vision East Riding Conference on Domestic Abuse & Violence Against Women and Girls for Church based faith sector

During the 16 of Activism we had a side chat on Facebook in which people could comment and say what they were doing. One such person was Councillor Linda Johnson, past Mayor of Beverley and a Methodist Local Preacher and Circuit Steward. I had a very productive conversation with her about what I hoped MWiB would be doing around the issue of violence against women and girls.



She then told me about what she does through her civic role in Beverley and the East Riding. She invited me to the Community Vision Day held at Toll Gavel United Church and Centre. This conference brought together those offering services in this sector; East Riding


Safeguarding Adults Board; East Riding Domestic violence and abuse partnership team; Jackie Bowes, Deputy Lieutenant. We also heard from charities involved with the issue of abuse.

I had a table with prototypes of our publicity

leaflets and had an opportunity to speak at the end about what MWiB stands for and what we

are hoping to do in the future. The paintings are done by a perpetrator of violence against women who has turned his life around and these portray his realisation of what effect he had on women.





NCW. In December we received an email from Ann Davison, the Vice President, inviting us to join them on their International steering group. I joined the team and learnt about the Commission on the Status of Women (CSW) event to be held at the UN headquarters in New York. This year is the 30th anniversary of the Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action where states set up a framework for gender equality and women's empowerment. It is a commitment by the international community to address gender inequality and assess the situation of women & the efforts of states to support women's empowerment. It affirms women's rights are human rights. This year will be an assessment of current challenges that affect the implementation of the declaration and what has been achieved towards the 2030 agenda for sustainable development.

The event will run from 10 March to 21 March with 12000 people attending. As well as the main business occurring in the UN Building there is an NGO Parallel event where discussions and side events will happen at various sites. I have the privilege of going to represent both NCW and MWiB and take part in this amazing event. I have had a variety of zoom and in person meetings to discuss what will be happening and what will be expected of me. There are over 120 delegates from a variety of organisations going from the UK. We had an opportunity of meeting with The Rt Hon Annaleise Dodds, Minister for Women and Equalities to hear the Governments position on the issues facing women and heard presentations from other organisations involved in advocacy for women's rights. I was able to network with those going to New York, sharing what we are hoping to do within MWiB.

I leave on 8th March and will be returning on 17th March. Whilst there I will be meeting







It came as a tremendous shock to many to hear the news that Liz Marriott had died suddenly. Liz was actively involved with Women's Network and MWiB

both locally and nationally. She served as an Area Representative on the Women's Network Connexional Committee at a particularly important time as we transitioned to be an independent movement. She was a member of the first Methodist Women in Britain Executive as Communications Officer which included being British Unit Correspondent for WFM&UCW. She enjoyed attending world assemblies in Johannesburg and Texas and European seminars in Italy and Porto, listening to women from around the world and making her contribution. Most recently Liz was a volunteer editor of Magnet, where she was able to share her love of photography and her faith through creative imagery.

Liz was passionate about encouraging girls to work in STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics). She loved riding her motorbike and dancing. She felt privileged after learning British Sign Language to be able to communicate with another group of people and often signed hymns and songs in worship.

Liz continued her involvement with MWiB & WFM&UCW after she and John moved 4 years ago to Germany to be near to their daughter, Rachel. It was great spending time with her in Porto & to see her online in December for the WFM&UCW Europe Area Christmas webinar. Harrison her grandson, aged 1, was the light of her life. Liz and John have made many friends in the churches and groups they belonged to and in the village where they lived. The church in Teupitz was full for her funeral service, with others joining on Zoom. It was very moving at the end of the bilingual service when everyone paused to lay a flower by her picture and urn at the front of the church as they left.

Using her skills and gifts in the service of God, Liz lived the ethos of Women's Network, MWiB and WFM&UCW as she encouraged, guided and inspired other women. We are so very grateful for her contribution and commitment. I have good memories of my friend & colleague and shall remember especially the many times we circle danced together.




